## PAPER AND CARDBOARD RECYCLING DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Residents in unincorporated Harris County in Spring and Klein who do not have a neighborhood or curbside recycling program have several options for recycling paper and cardboard. Containers are located at schools in the Klein and Spring ISDs and at many area churches and parks. Wet and food-soiled paper and cardboard are not accepted. Plastic and aluminum are not accepted, except at the Meyer Park location. Glass is not accepted.

## RECYCLING GUIDELINES

### PAPER

- Recycle dry, clean paper, magazines and newspaper. Paper must be put in paper grocery sacks before placing in the recycling bin.
- DO NOT** place paper in plastic grocery bags.
- DO NOT** put wet paper in the recycling bin.

### CARDBOARD

- Facilities accept dry, clean cardboard only. Flatten boxes before placing in the recycling bin.
- DO NOT** put wet or food-contaminated cardboard in the recycling bin, such as pizza boxes.

### PLASTIC AND ALUMINUM

- Remove all caps from plastic bottles and containers.
- Rinse all plastic and aluminum recyclables.
- Place plastic and aluminum into plastic bags.
- Place bags in collection containers.

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Waste, HHW, can be taken to the Harris County facility at 6900 Hahl Road, Houston. The facility is open to residents of unincorporated Harris County.

## SAFELY DISPOSE OF OILS AND FATS

Fats, oils and grease can block flow in household plumbing lines, causing overflow and waterway pollution. To keep the environment free of fats, oil and grease, residents are encouraged to dispose of those fluids at the HHW facility. Residents should remove food from dishes before washing or placing them in a dishwasher.

HHW is open Wednesdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., the second Saturday of the month from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and the fourth Saturday of the month in select months. See the calendar at [eng.hctx.net](http://eng.hctx.net) for more information.
